

## Class Rankings/Grade Point Averages

The Board directs the Division of Learning Services to establish and monitor the procedures for determining class rank and honors.

Class rank shall be determined by computing the grade point average (GPA). This GPA shall include all grades earned during the regular school year by the end of the eighth semester. Grades attempted through programs outside the regular school day, which includes those for summer schools, will only be considered for making up regular semester failures and will not receive weighted grading. Programs administrated through the district (i.e. concurrent enrollment) shall be part of the regular school day.

The GPA shall be determined by dividing the total number of points by the total number of classes. Each student transcript will reflect a weighted and non-weighted GPA.

Non-weighted GPA for regular courses shall be awarded as follows:

### Grade percent range

A = 4.00	90-100
B = 3.00	80-89
C = 2.00	70-79
D = 1.00	60-69
F = 0.00	Below 60

Weighted GPA for advanced placement, college courses and honors courses shall be awarded as follows:

### Grade percent range

A = 5.00	92-100
B = 4.00	82-91
C = 3.00	72-81
D = 2.00	65-71
F = 0.00	Below 65

### **Class rank**

To ascertain rank in class, students' weighted grade point averages shall be listed in order from the highest to the lowest and numbered accordingly, starting with rank one for the highest. Significantly Limited Intellectual Capacity (SLIC) students shall not be ranked. Early graduates forfeit their right to be ranked

### **Honors**

A valedictorian and salutatorian shall be designated from the senior class. When applicable, co-valedictorians and/or co-salutatorians shall be designated.

The method of selecting the student commencement speaker(s) shall be left to the discretion of each high school.

Honors and advanced placement courses shall be recorded on the high school transcript in a manner that makes them clearly discernible.

### **Honor rolls**

Each high school shall compile and publish a list every nine weeks of all students who have attained a sufficiently high GPA to earn honor roll designation.

An honor roll list may be compiled at the middle school each nine weeks.

Honor roll will be determined by GPA as will National Honor Society membership.
